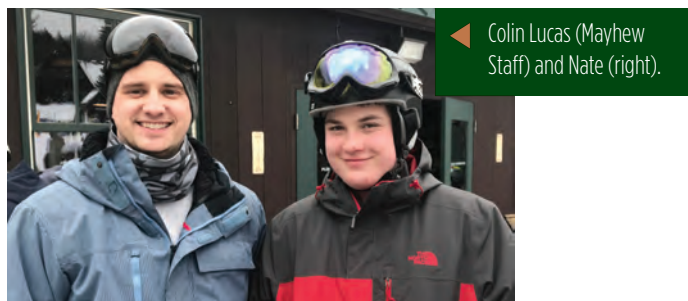

In 2019, he will be back at Pasquaney before attending Cardigan Mountain School on a full scholarship in the fall. As busy as he is, Domineaq still enjoys regular visits with his Mayhew Outreach Worker Dylan Bell and he loves finding ways to contribute to his community.

Nate, Monadnock Region, Enrolled 2013

Nate continues to challenge himself in setting and reaching impressive goals. This past year, he became even more involved with his town's fire department and he also stepped up as a volunteer firefighter with the Keene Explorers. Both opportunities have helped him build his knowledge and understanding of what it takes to be a firefighter and an EMT. Nate has also completed his certification in Wilderness First Aid. REMEMBERING TWO EXTRAORDINARY ROLE MODELS

With the preface that these words can't help but fall far short in relaying all that Jane and Bruce meant – and mean...

JANE FOSTER

(TRUSTEE 1981-2016, TRUSTEE EMERITA 2016-2018):

Jane was just two weeks shy of her 91st birthday when she passed away on May 9, 2018. For more than 37 of Mayhew's 50 years, she led us with her steadfastness in challenging times, her agile thinking and common sense, careful listening, hard work and dedication – and always – her warm and mischievous sense of humor. During an overnight planning retreat on Mayhew Island in the mid-90's, Jane was among the most senior participants but her innovative thoughts and nose-to-the-grindstone approach set a high bar. And in the evening, when the day's work was done, she was the life of the party.

Over her next two decades of service on the Board, the only thing that seemed to change with Jane was her declining eyesight. When she stopped driving, she found rides to all the Mayhew meetings and events. I miss driving with her from her home in Center Sandwich to Concord and elsewhere. It was a trek through the hills and along Squam Lake but as soon as Jane got in the car, the ride was filled with her good thinking, stories of service and family. I never stopped learning from her or laughing with her. Even as her eyesight failed, there wasn't a thing wrong with her vision. She saw beyond the horizon. She saw life in ways that helped so many of us see anew.

BRUCE JOHNSTONE

(TRUSTEE 1989-1995):

Bruce died April 10, 2018 at the age of 79. His unassuming strength and "How can I help?" approach were his calling cards. Just five months after becoming a trustee, Bruce was a key figure in the effort to rebuild Mayhew Island's Owen Lindsay Lodge, following the devastating fire of 1990. Four years later, he led the search for Mayhew's next executive director when Al Cantor announced he would be stepping down to begin a new challenge with the NH Charitable Foundation. Upon his own departure from a formal role with Mayhew in 1995, Bruce continued to be a faithful and dear friend, one of Mayhew's most active advocates, especially in the Upper Valley, which he called home.

Newfound Lake was also home. As family lore has it, Bruce's grandfather hooked a giant lake trout that fought him across most of Newfound in the mid 1920's. It was the beginning of a family love affair with the lake and the area that has now spanned five generations. Thankfully, Newfound's biggest island and its residents hooked Bruce's interest years ago. He was a mentor and friend to me – and so many others at Mayhew. I most admired Bruce's class and grace and unflappable way of dealing with challenge. He always had me coming away from our conversations with a new perspective and energy. Spending time with Bruce meant seeing his belief in others and his ceaseless work to help make things better. Knowing him is a gift – and a call to action.

HELPING THE BOYS FIND THEIR BEST

It often feels as though there is no greater challenge, for the boys – or for everyone here with them. We’re enormously grateful this *we* includes *you*, along with the boys, their families, Mayhew alumni, dedicated contributors, the staff, board and so many others.

What are the boys, their families and this team up against? Consider this: In 2018, among the 10-12-year-olds in the program, **50%** of the families had at least one member who was struggling with substance abuse or who had experienced incarceration and **50%** of the families had experienced domestic violence. **76%** had household incomes at or below 150% of the poverty level. Here’s a look at what the boys can accomplish – despite the challenges they face – when Mayhew really comes together in their support (*pseudonyms* used):

Housing Authority Official, referring 12-year-old *Carl*: **“Carl, more than any young boy I know, needs the Mayhew experience to carry him through the rough years ahead or I honestly believe he will not make it.”**

Carl at 27: **“Mayhew helped me realize the importance of working together with others, regardless of differences. I learned that putting others before myself can be very gratifying.”**

School Counselor, referring 10-year-old *Wyatt*: **“Wyatt needs a real positive male role model in his life...This year, he has shown more anger, more episodes of real rage or violence. Wyatt is in crisis and at risk.”**

Wyatt at 31: **“I am the first person to stay married in my family and the first to graduate from college. I have a very happy, healthy marriage and four beautiful, healthy daughters. I own my own home, have a great job and love to volunteer in my community. I believe I would have none of that if I never had Mayhew.”**

Social Worker, referring 10-year-old *Paxton*: **“I met Paxton as a lonely and isolated first grader who had a tendency to space out so completely that he sometimes forgot to go to school.”**

Paxton at 37: **“The idea of giving back to the community and teamwork were very important skills that I first learned at Mayhew. I had to learn to work within a team for the first time and began the process of learning about how people communicate and solve problems together. I have been volunteering in the community a great deal over the past 6 years and I think the heart of that was learned at Mayhew.”**

MAYHEW ENDOWMENTS

Mayhew annually draws 4.5% of the average value of the endowment to support current operations. The endowment is overseen by the board's Investment Committee. In 2018, the annual draw was equivalent to the program tuition for 22 boys (age 10-12) to participate in Mayhew's residential summer and school-year mentoring programs.

The Importance of Both Annual and Endowment Support

Mayhew is unique in that it offers the boys deep and long-term support so they can find their best. It is also unique in that, as a tuition-free program for them, it has no source of earned income. Having a healthy endowment has been crucial to helping support current programming for the boys and to strengthening and expanding programming for them in the future. Without the endowment, Mayhew could not have succeeded in extending from two years, then to six years and now to eight years of year-round support for every boy.

And, yet, the endowment is only able to do so much. Each year, more than 90% of Mayhew's annual needs must be met by a combination of funds from grants, special events, United Ways and contributions from people just like you.

2018 TREASURER'S REPORT

PROGRAM ACTIVITY

We had another year of increased contributions and support for our annual programming. This was critically necessary as costs to deliver enhanced services to the boys continue to rise. Total resources reached \$1,304,867 which allowed us to cover operating expenses of \$1,285,619 and provide a small operating surplus: before making loan principal payments, positive cash flow from operations was \$19,248. As in 2017, we continued to make significant capital improvements on Mayhew Island (home to the program's summer camp for the boys) which were capitalized and in addition to the expenses totaled above.

INVESTMENT AND CAPITAL CAMPAIGN ACTIVITY

2018 was a complete reversal from 2017 regarding investment performance, with our endowment losing exactly half of the previous year's gain, or \$295,446. This was in addition to providing the annual program draw which was necessary to meet cash flow requirements. Now that our capital campaign is over contributions to the endowment are unpredictable, and we thank everyone who continues to contribute.

FINANCING ACTIVITY

Existing debt was reduced on schedule by \$14,738.

The net result of all operations was a reduction in our cash reserves of \$256,484. Despite that disappointing result, Mayhew finished 2018 still in a strong financial position, thanks to the endowment we've built over recent years with your help. This shines a bright light on why the support of all our friends is so critical for the future of our boys.

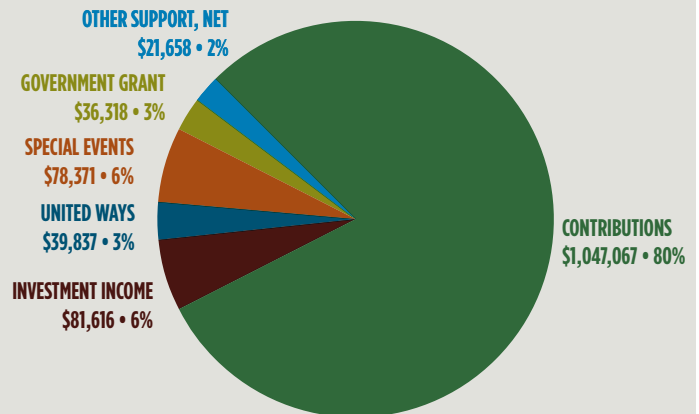

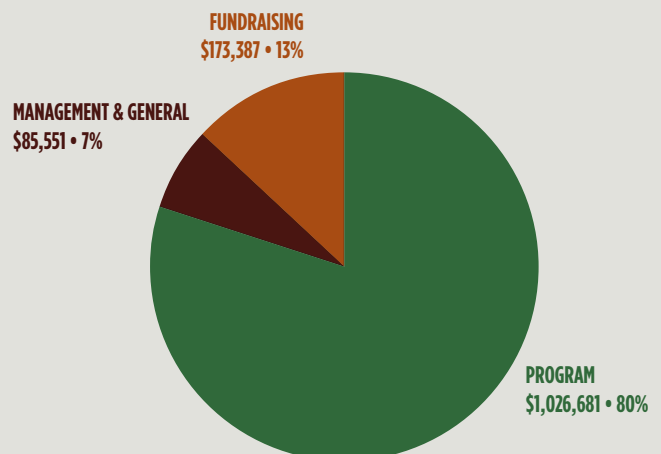

INCOME TOTAL REVENUES \$1,304,867

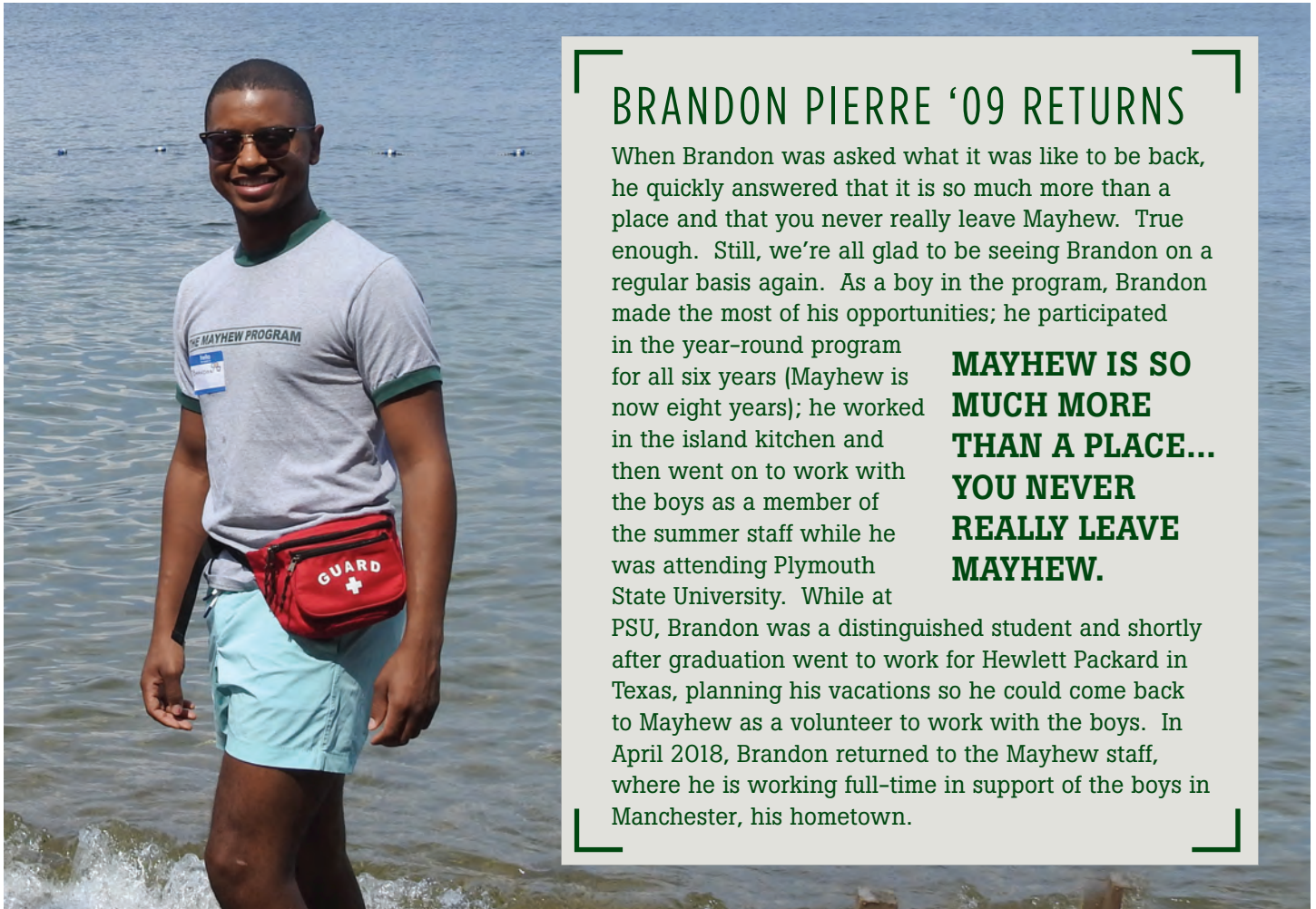


EXPENSES TOTAL EXPENSES \$1,285,619
